How to Leave a Legacy

Making a will protects your wishes and can have positive implications on inheritance tax when choosing to leave a gift.

You can choose to write a will yourself, but this should be verified by a solicitor to ensure your wishes will be carried out. By working with a solicitor to write your will they will be able to explain the best options for you and give advice that is confidential and puts your interests first, and assures your will is executed according to your wishes.

We recommend that you seek the advice of a solicitor before choosing what type of legacy you would like to leave.

If you already have a will and wish to add a gift to CMI, this can be done using a codicil. A codicil need not change the terms of your current will, it can simply add a new instruction. Please make sure you store the codicil with your original will.

How your legacy will be used

We understand that some people choosing to leave a will regard this as a private decision that should only be shared with family. If you are considering leaving a gift to CMI, please consider contacting us to discuss how you would like your gift to be used.

Since 1978, Filmhouse has been Edinburgh's foremost independent cinema, celebrating world cinema in all its brilliance and diversity. A three-screen cinema in the heart of the city, it shows a wide range of films, from quality crowd-pleasers and family films to esoteric arthouse works, via restored classics, retrospectives and themed seasons and festivals. Filmhouse's programme includes around 700 films and events each year, as well as hosting Edinburgh International Film Festival, and a wide ranging education and learning programme for all ages.
